Famos tried crowing at the crocodiles to get them out of the jungle. But the crocodiles weren't scared of the crowing and they laughed at him.

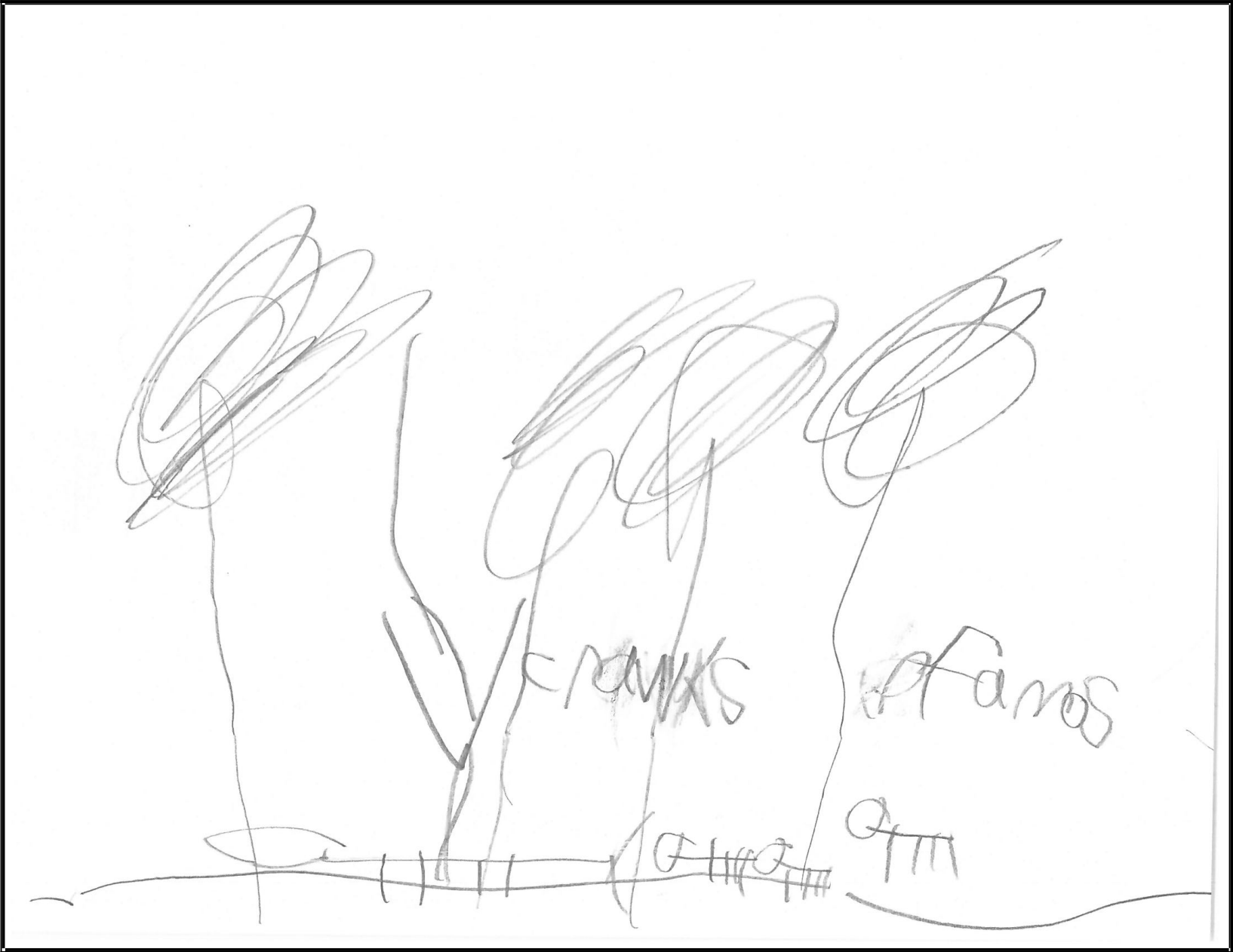
