Setting is more than just the location of your story. It's also the mood of your story: if your character is a little girl and you want to write a scary story, the setting could be a dark forest or a haunted house. But if you want to write a happy story, she could be in a meadow of flowers, or living on a rainbow! Once you've decided on your mood, you can use details and descriptive words (looks, smells, sounds and emotions) for each of the important places in your story.
